

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

We celebrate Epiphany today and hear how God's very self is revealed to people of all nations through the Incarnation. The emphasis today is on this revelation to foreigners: the

foreign nations that will now pay tribute to the restored Jerusalem, the Gentiles whom Paul recognized as now being copartners through the gospel, and the magi from the east who recognized the Messiah and paid him homage.

From Fr. Romanus

Key point of today's Reflection The Manifestation of the Lord:

Our loving Lord who revealed Himself to the three wise men by the guidance of a star, so they could come and worship Him, the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6) and King of Kings (Revelations 19:16), gives each one of us the same light of revelation to lead us to Himself – to recognize and accept Him as our Lord and Savior. Just like the three wise men, we are led by the "star" on our way through life – the Spirit of Christ who dwells in us; like the three wise men, our ultimate happiness is in finding Jesus, and our final destination is in Christ Jesus Who is the Way, the Truth and the Life (cf. John 14:6). As the three wise men followed the direction of the Star, so may we follow the direction of our Good Shepherd.

The Journey of the Magi



"The destiny of every person is symbolized in this journey of the Magi of the East. Our life is a journey, illuminated by the lights which brighten our way, to find the fullness of truth and of love, which we Christians recognize in Jesus,

the Light of the World."

Pope Francis stated that, in "following a light," the Three Kings actually sought "the Light. The star appearing in the sky kindled in their minds and in their hearts a light that moved them to seek the great Light of Christ. In our own journey searching for this light, the Pope emphasized that, like the Magi, every person has two great 'books' that provide the signs to guide this pilgrimage. These books, he revealed, are "the book of creation and the book of sacred Scripture." What is most important, noted the Holy Father, "is that we be attentive, alert and listen to God, who speaks to us," adding that, in "listening to the Gospel, reading it, meditating on it and making it our spiritual nourishment especially enables us to encounter the living Jesus, to experience him and his love."
