Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

On the Sunday after Christmas we celebrate Jesus' human family. Appropriate to the season, we usually visualize the Holy Family as they appear in the typical nativity scene: the baby Jesus lying in a manger, surrounded by his doting parents. But Joseph, Mary, and Jesus lived together for many years, through Jesus' infancy, childhood, adolescence, and maybe even into his adulthood. As we celebrate the Holy Family, let us think of the families we have been a part of, both as children and as adults.

From the Pastor's Desk



From Fr. Romanus:
Key point of today's Reflection

The Holy Family:

Each time we about the Holy Family, referring to the family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus, we got the impression that it was a perfect family that did not have any crisis and challenges as our own families do. This is not the case. What is so peculiar or distinctive about this family is that it was a family where each member listened to the voice of God in their lives and determined to put God's will in their lives above all other things. Mary was told by Angel Gabriel that she was to be conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit in order to be the Mother of the Messiah. She knew that in Jewish culture, if a married woman conceived outside her relationship with her husband, the Jews law states that such a woman should be stoned to death publicly. Yet, Mary accepted this responsibly in as much as God said so. When Joseph realized that Mary was pregnant, he wanted to divorce her quietly. On the contrary, God told him in a mere dream not to do so, but to take Mary as his wife. When Joseph awoke from his dream, he did just as God directed him. The teen Jesus knew that he should be under his parents, but he could not ignore the voice of his Father who sent him into the word, urging him to begin his ministry. From the example of the Holy Family, we learn that when we listen to God's will in our lives, everything will at the end be perfect; when we let the Lord His way in our lives, He leads us to the realization of the plans He has for us.
