WEEKLY REFLECTIONS:

Jesus, Through The Holy Spirit, Unites Us With The Father:

Today's feast invites us to live in the awareness of the presence of the Triune God within us: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The mystery of the Holy Trinity is one of the fundamental doctrines of Christianity and the greatest mystery of our Faith, namely, that there are Three Divine Persons, sharing the same Divine nature in one God. "There is one God, who has three Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Each Person is God, yet there is still only one God" (Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) #234, #253-256). We have the Father Who is the Creator, the Son Who is the Redeemer and the Holy Spirit Who is the Sanctifier and the Counselor – One God.

The doctrine of Three Persons in one God, co-equal and co-eternal in Divinity yet distinct in Person, is not explicitly spelled out in the Bible. Even the very word "Trinity" is not found in the Bible. But the doctrine of the Trinity underlies all major Christian feasts. All the official prayers of the Church, including the Holy Mass and the Sacraments, begin with an address to the Holy Trinity: "In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". We are baptized, absolved of our sins, and anointed in the name of the Blessed Trinity. We bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross, invoking the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and we conclude our prayers glorifying the Holy Trinity, saying "Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit".

Today's readings convey the fundamental mystery that the Triune God reaches out to us with love, seeking the deepest communion with us. God created us to share in the Trinitarian family. When God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness" (Gen. 1:26), he was consulting with the Son and the Holy Spirit to create man to share in the bond of the Holy Trinity. This is God's intention for our human family – to love one another and in perfect peace and unity like the Holy Trinity.
